FROM THE NATURE CONSERVANCY AUSTRALIA Restoring shellfish reefs in the Bay

This information came across my computer about six months ago, is still relevant and is really interesting reading.

A crucial component of TNC's shellfish reef restoration work is the preparation of recycled shells to grow oysters on at the Victorian Shellfish Hatchery in Queenscliff. The purpose of this activity is to clean and bag the recycled shells. These shells will be used as shell cultch and be seeded with baby oysters to then place on the new shellfish reefs. It is important for the restored reefs to be regularly monitored to understand how the reefs' oyster and mussel populations are doing, as well as to check overall reef health and biodiversity levels. Terrific to read that there was an improvement of the survival rate of seeded oysters at the Dromana site for 2021/22 compared to 2020/21.

Log on to TNC's Reef Builder Project in Port Phillip Bay and see the good work being done to get shellfish back into Port Phillip Bay and how to become involved.

Our updated Best Practices Guide to Pest Seastar Removal in Port Phillip Bay

Teams of volunteers of the <u>Community Rapid</u> <u>Response Teams</u> project have been training to remove pest Northern Pacific Seastars (NPS) from the Bay. With help from divers from <u>Earthcare St Kilda</u> and <u>Diveline Scuba Centre</u>, they collected citizen science data on more than 3200 pest seastars!

To make it easier for people to organise their own pest seastar removals outside of any projects, the EcoCentre has updated our 2013 manual <u>'Best</u> Practice Guidelines for NPS Removal in Port Phillip

<u>Bay, 2022'.</u> It offers practical tips on how to organise your own removals, the things you need to know and prepare for before you go out, get in and get amongst it, and a great pest seastar identification guide.

The project is designed for Rapid Response Teams of local volunteers to respond to mass aggregations of NPS in the Bay. If you see lots and lots of orangey-purple, 5-armed seastars congregating on your favourite beach plotting to take over the world, please let us know ASAP and activate your local Rapid Response Team.

Download your free copy of the manual here and join your local Rapid Response Team here. This project was funded by the Victorian Government, under the Port Phillip Bay Fund.
